- Start planning a summer street party. Partner with another local organisation
- What can you see now that you couldn't see before Covid?

We know that some of you have already begun to have a break away, and I know that more of you are thinking what might be possible for you. If you are managing a time away then I hope that you have a refreshing but safe trip. Gwen and I are hoping to see Daniel and his family for a couple of days near London as we take the caravan for a week to Dorset for Andrew and his family over the Spring school break at the end of May. We are planning to come back in between taking and fetching it, but we might get a couple of days in it ourselves either side of that; our own safe bubble.
